Leave the kittens alone. Even if you don't see her, the mother is probably nearby and caring for them. Cats can be gone for hours and kittens instinctually remain silent to not attract predators. If the kittens are in a dangerous area, gently move them, with their nesting material/area to a safe spot, not too far from where you found them.

We strongly encourage you to sign them up to get spayed/neutered and vaccinated against rabies as soon as they're 3lbs/3 months old. Friendly cats live outdoors as community cats too. Just be sure to get their honorary ear tip if that's the best option for the kitten. If this is not an option, then you will need to go to your local shelter and set up an appoinment to surrender them. If they are larger than 3lbs/3 months, the shelter will neuter and return them to your neighborhood afterwards.

Tip: White cats do not belong outdoors due to predators. Indoor/pet cats should not be forced outdoors either. Community cats are unowned cats the entire neighborhood cares for. These are not indoor/outdoor house cats.



Tip: There are numerous resources for <u>rehoming</u> animals online. Check into websites as well as the various social media sites.



Tip: Tattoos can be found on the underbelly of cats who have been spayed/neutered. Typically these are thin, green/blue lines somewhere between the belly button and the pelvis.



Tip: Place a ring of flour around the nesting area so you can be certain mom is returning to them.



Tip: Cat moms clean their young by brushing their fur the opposite direction. If the kitten is clean and "fluffed" then the mom hasn't been gone too long.



Most animal shelters and rescue organizations have a foster program to help the neediest of animals stay out of shelters, and in homes. Asking an organization how YOU can help the kitten is the best way to get all the supplies you need, at no cost, and help the kitten out at the same time. You'll be a lifesaver!
