In August, we ...

Accepted 20 cats and 5 rats into our foster program.

Assisted **35 animals** with finding their forever families. Yay!

Transported 144 cats and 13 dogs to get fixed and vaccinated, bringing our year-to-date total up to 891 animals!

Served 11 dogs and 23 cats during our monthly pet food pantry. That included:

- · 117 pounds of dry dog food
- · 97 pounds of dry cat food
- · 54 cans of wet dog food.
- · 82 cans of wet cat food
- · Plus treats, pads, bowls, medicine, and more!

We'd like to give a huge THANK YOU to Betty
Pullman from YMCA! Through our donors' help and
our partnership with Meals on Wheels, we've
provided food for the pets of our local senior
citizens. We delivered 8 pounds of dry dog food, 88
pounds of dry cat food, and 21 cans of wet cat
food!


